LOCAL RULES & INFORMATION

RESIDENCE: Open to all juniors under the age of 19 in Fresno County (must be a member of appropriate club or chapter to enter those divisions).

JUDGING RESULTS: All judging results are confidential until the opening day of the fair, October 1, 2009. Violation of this can lead to loss of awards given. There will be no exceptions.

AGE REQUIREMENTS: All Jr. Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 as of January 1, 2009.

DESIGNS PER CLASS: There may be *no more than 15 entries* in each class with the same design per teacher.

ENTRY FORMS: All entries must be made on official entry forms furnished by the Fair management. Entry form **MUST** be signed by exhibitor and the instructor (Parent/Guardian if independent).

FEATURE EXHIBITS: The Big Fresno Fair expects all 4-H and FFA members exhibiting at the fair to be actively involved in the design, construction, & installation of all Feature Exhibits (Booths) Instructors and adults may supervise only. Technical professionals will not be allowed during the installation. Non-compliance with this rule will result in the following:

- a. **First Concern:** Verbal warning
- b. **Second Concern:** Written warning
- c. **Third Concern:** Withholding of premiums

AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING: The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.

DANISH SYSTEM: The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first places, etc. as merited.

DISQUALIFICATION: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry which is not in the best interest of the Fair & reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor(s) who conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner or who enters in an inappropriate Division, without discussion or justification. No payment of any awards will be made to individuals so disqualified.

COMPLETION OF ENTRIES: All work must be completed prior to delivery

INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS: Independent exhibitors must be age 9 or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2009 and may compete thru December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age. Independent exhibitors must have parent or guardian sign entry form.

RULES

QUALITY OF EXHIBITS: The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, & such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for cash awards.

MATURITY: SECTION 42515: "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.

OVERRIPE: SECTION 42515: "Overripe" means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.

PRODUCTION OF EXHIBIT: Agriculture & Horticulture products MUST have been produced by the exhibitor.

VARIETIES: All varieties must be named on entry form. No substitutions will be allowed at time of entry or the entries will be disqualified.

NON-LISTED VARIETIES: Varieties for which there are no classes listed in the Exhibitors Handbook cannot be entered for competition. Feel free to make suggestions.

DISQUALIFICATION: Any entry not properly entered will not be judged.

RULES: Rules as to quality or quantity will be strictly adhered to.

GRAINS: All grains entered shall be untreated.

VEGETABLES: Vegetables may be waxed for preservation.

COLD STORAGE: A section of the cold storage building will be set aside for FFA use. Place your school's products in this area only & list chapter name on the containers.

Products should/will be checked every 7 to 10 days, for spoilage, by the exhibitor. Moldy products will be dumped by the Cold Storage Management.

PICK-UP: Any Agriculture or Horticulture exhibit not picked up by 6 P.M., Oct. 20, 2009 will be disposed of by the Fair.

ENTRY FORM: Agriculture and Horticulture entries may be placed on the same entry form.

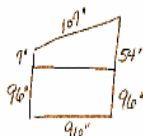

ENTRY FORMS: Use the "special group" entry form located in back of exhibitor's handbook. Entry forms will NOT be accepted by fax.

ELIGIBILITY: Only projects made in Fresno County Public or Private secondary schools may be entered. Projects must be made under the supervision of Vocational Education teachers. (Students may not have similar projects in other Fresno Fair exhibits).

JUDGING SCALE: Refer to local rules for judging scale

COMPLETION: Projects must have been completed during the 12 month period preceding the Fair. (Incomplete projects will not be accepted.)

CONSTRUCTION: Component parts of a project should be made by the student whenever possible. Projects made from assembly kits and/or molds will be judged accordingly and must be identified.

DRAFTING REQUIREMENTS: ALL drafting division entries MUST be mounted. Overall dimensions *cannot* exceed 24" by 36". Entries consisting of more than one page must be prints rather than originals. These must be stapled with smaller pages at the top & larger drawings on the bottom. Last page must be mounted.

SIZE RESTRICTION: Projects requiring more than 24 square feet or an area larger than 4' x 6' must be approved by the Superintendent.

SMALL PROJECTS: Small or fragile entries must be affixed to suitable stiff backing for display and security.

DAMAGED PROJECT: Teacher and/or student will be notified of any project that arrives damaged or with missing parts, and teacher or student must make needed repairs before opening day of the fair.

DISPLAY DURATION: All entries entered must be left on display for duration of fair unless prior approval is given by Superintendent.

DELIVERY: All entries shall be delivered to and from the Fresno Fairgrounds at the expense and responsibility of the participant.

JUDGING CRITERIA

DESIGN: Suitability of material, originality, initiative in design, proportion, balance, detail.

WORKMANSHIP: Mechanical perfection, manipulation excellence, accuracy or assembly.

DECORATION AND/OR SURFACE ENRICHMENT: Accuracy, neatness, appropriateness, cleanliness, finish, artistic effects, embellishments, special finishes and/or techniques.

DIFFICULTY AND/OR SCOPE OF PROJECT/PROCESS: Appropriateness for class and grade level, team involvement, career preparation, community service, articulation, integration and problem solving.

OTHER FACTORS: Utility, practicality, usability, technology as it applies to the workplace, ornamental, model, operational excellence, how well does the project operate.
